Page 6: Level 2 picture board in black and white- You get 19 spring pictures. Many are the same pictures as the color board, but all pictures are in a different placement on the board.




















Page 8: Suggested multi-step directions for Level 2 boards















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




Prompts for Level 1 Following Directions Board

- 1) Find something that has black stripes and wings.
- 2) Find something that grows in the ground and has petals.
- 3) Find something that is an insect you could catch with a net.
- 4) Find something that a bird would build.
- 5) Find something that has a shell and moves slowly.
- 6) Find something that you could hold to help you stay dry in the rain.
- 7) Find something that has long ears and can hop.
- 8) Find something that you could fly on a windy day.
- 9) Find something green that says “ribbit.”
- 10) Find something that you could wear on your feet when it rains.





Prompts for Level 2 Following Directions Board

- 1) Find something that has petals and grows in the ground.
- 2) Find an insect that makes honey and can sting you.
- 3) Find something you could use to catch butterflies.
- 4) Find an animal that has feathers and is usually yellow.
- 5) Find something that you could use to move a lot of heavy dirt in your garden. (color board only)
- 6) Find something colorful that might appear after it rains.
- 7) Find something that has a handle that will keep you dry in the rain.
- 8) Find an animal that eats flies and is good at jumping.
- 9) Find something that you could use to cut your grass. (color board only)
- 10) Find something a bird might build in a tree.
- 11) Find something that could keep your feet dry when you walk in puddles.
- 12) Find an insect that is red with black spots.
- 13) Find something you could plant under the dirt to grow flowers or vegetables. (color board only)
- 14) Find something that eats leaves and has a lot of legs.
- 15) Find something that you can use to dig holes in your garden.
- 16) Find something that has buttons and keeps you dry in the rain.
- 17) Find an insect that comes out of a cocoon and has wings.
- 18) Find an animal that has a hard shell and moves slowly.
- 19) Find something you could use to water the flowers in your garden. (color board only)
- 20) Find something you could fly on a windy day.
- 21) Find an animal that has long ears and a fluffy tail.
- 22) Find something green that grows on trees. (black and white board only)
- 23) Find something that can be grey or white. Rain and lightning come out of it. (Black and white board only)

Multi-Step Directions for Level 2 Board

These directions will all work with both the color and black/white boards

2-part directions

- 1) After you touch the bee, touch something that grows in the ground.
- 2) Touch something you use to dig, then touch an animal with a shell.
- 3) First touch the rainbow, then touch something you wear on your feet.
- 4) Touch something with buttons, next touch the net.
- 5) After you touch something a bird builds, touch the frog.
- 6) Touch the umbrella, then touch something you can fly on a windy day.
- 7) First touch an animal with long ears, then touch an animal with feathers.
- 8) After you touch an insect with black spots, touch the butterfly.
- 9) First touch the kite, then touch an insect with many legs.
- 10) Touch something you hold in the rain, then touch something you use to catch butterflies.

3-part directions

- 1) Touch the chick, then the turtle, then the butterfly.
- 2) First touch the rabbit, then touch the frog, and last touch the flower.
- 3) After you touch the net, then touch the rainbow, and last touch the shovel.
- 4) Touch the nest, then the boots, then the kite.
- 5) After you touch the raincoat, touch the kite, then the rainbow.
- 6) First touch the umbrella, then the caterpillar, and last touch the rabbit.
- 7) First touch the bee, second touch the ladybug, and third touch the butterfly.
- 8) After you touch the boots, touch the umbrella, and then touch the chick.
- 9) Touch the kite, then touch the frog, then touch the turtle.
- 10) First touch the rainbow, second touch the flower, and third touch the nest.
